WHAT ARE COOKIES?

A Cookie is a small text file (typically made up of letters and numbers) placed in the memory of your browser or device when you visit a website. Cookies allow a website to recognize a particular device or browser and store some information about the user's preferences or past actions on the website. For example, Cookies enable a website to remember your actions and preferences over a period of time, so you don't have to keep re-entering them whenever you come back to the site or browse from one page to another.

HOW WE USE COOKIES

In order to enhance your experience on our website and using our service, nanopay may store Cookies on your device. As explained above, nanopay uses Cookies to save you time and extra effort while using our website, and also to help us track and target your interests, as well as the interests of other customers. For our nanopay site and applications, we may use unique identifiers tied to the browser, application, or device you're using. A unique identifier is a string of characters that can be used to uniquely identify a browser, app, or device. These identifier enable you to perform essential functions on the website, such as remembering a repeat form fields item within a browsing session.

Google Analytics:

We may use Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google Inc. (Google), which uses identifiers such as Cookies, app instance IDs and IP addresses to measure user interactions with our websites and/or apps, and give us a sense of where in the world our users come from.

- First-party Cookies: Google Analytics collects first-party Cookies, data related to the device/browser, IP address and on-site/app activities to measure and report statistics about user interactions on the websites and/or apps that use Google Analytics. For more information on the type of cookies used, go here.
- Advertising identifiers: we may use the Google Analytics Advertising Feature where Google advertising Cookies are collected and used to enable features like Remarketing on the Google Display Network. For more information about how Google uses advertising Cookies, go here.
- *IP Address:* Google Analytics uses IP addresses to derive the geolocation of a visitor, and to protect the service and provide security to our customers.

In addition to Google Analytics, we may use the Google Maps API to help pre-fill in address information. To learn more about Google's privacy practices, go <u>here</u>.

Crazy Egg Tracking Script:

We may use Cookies used by the Crazy Egg Script to monitor visitors and track visitor activity on our sites. The Cookies may contain a cookie value that allows Crazy Egg to detect if you are a returning visitor or a first-time visitor. No Personally Identifiable Information relating to you are stored within such



cookies. The use of these cookies is further described in Crazy Egg Script's <u>Privacy Policy</u> and <u>Cookie Policy</u>.

Third Party Cookies:

If you go on to a web page that contains embedded content, for example from Facebook or YouTube, you may be sent Cookies from these websites. We do not control the generation of these Cookies, so we suggest that you check the individual third-party websites for more information about their cookies and how to manage them.

WHAT IF I WANT TO CONTROL MY COOKIE PERMISSIONS?

You can configure your browser to refuse all cookies or to indicate when a Cookie is being sent. For information on how to control Cookies from your browser go AboutCookies.org - Control. For information on how to delete Cookies from your browser visit AboutCookies.org - Delete. If you choose to decline Cookies, certain features of the website may not function properly or may not remain accessible to you.
